Traffic Patterns to Change in the New Town Area

Cramerton Board of Commissioners passed an amendment to the Town of Cramerton Code of Ordinances at their regularly scheduled meeting on May 6 that will affect traffic patterns on certain streets in the New Town area. The newly adopted ordinances will take effect on July 1, 2008. Residents can expect to see new signage installed shortly before the effective date.

Based on recommendations from the Mayor appointed New Town Committee, the Board of Commissioners voted unanimously to change Fourteenth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth and Seventeenth Streets to one-way streets. Traffic traveling Fourteenth and Sixteenth Streets will run from Woodlawn Avenue toward Mayflower Street. Traffic traveling Fifteenth and Seventeenth Streets will run from Mayflower Street toward Woodlawn Avenue. Parking will be allowed on these streets on the left side of the road in the direction of traffic. Curbs on the streets will be marked at fifty (50) feet from each intersection and parking will not be allowed in those areas. Current Town Ordinances and State Laws prohibiting parking on the sidewalk, parking in front of a driveway, etc. will be enforced. To park on the roadway vehicles must be operable, properly registered and have valid inspection stickers. Boats and recreational vehicles are prohibited from parking on the roadway. Vehicles in excess of seven (7) feet are prohibited from on-street parking.

Woodlawn Avenue, Thirteenth Street and Eighteenth Street will remain no parking and will continue to allow two-way traffic.
